

Important Message from AOS 96 Superintendent of Schools

I am writing to inform everyone that the Maine CDC announced today that Washington County was moved from the “green” designation to the “yellow” designation regarding the spread of the Covid-19 virus. The “yellow” designation indicates an increased(moderate) level of community risk. Due to the increased risk, schools may consider additional precautions, such as limiting the number of people in school buildings, suspending extracurricular or co-curricular activities, including competitions between schools, limiting interaction through cohorting, or other measures based on the unique needs of each school community.

All AOS 96 schools have developed alternate plans in anticipation of a change in our county designation to “yellow”. Your Building Principal will be sending all parents a message describing their plan to address the safety and educational needs of your children in the midst of a new county Covid-19 designation. We urge everyone to be vigilant implementing the safeguards the CDC has communicated to all community members that will help slow the spread of the virus. Our top priority is to keep our students, parents, staff members and other members of our community safe.

Your Building Principal will be sending you instructions regarding changes that will be implemented in your school due to our county Covid-19 designation changing from “green” to “yellow”.
